PRAYERS FOR SPIRITUAL COMMUNION



Spiritual communion, in the words of St Thomas Aquinas, is "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Here you can find a selection of prayers that may be of help in making an act of spiritual communion.

Act of Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. (St Alphonsus Liguori)

At Thy feet, O my Jesus, I prostrate myself and I offer Thee repentance of my contrite heart, which is humbled in its nothingness and in Thy holy presence. I adore Thee in the Sacrament of Thy love, the ineffable Eucharist. I desire to receive Thee into the poor dwelling that my heart offers Thee. While waiting for the happiness of sacramental communion, I wish to possess Thee in spirit. Come to me, O my Jesus, since I, for my part, am coming to Thee! May Thy love embrace my whole being in life and in death. I believe in Thee, I hope in Thee, I love Thee. Amen. (Attributed to Servant of God Raphael Cardinal Merry del Val)

Lord Jesus Christ, Grant that my soul, as I receive Thee spiritually, may hunger ever more for Thee, Who art the bread of angels, the comforting nourishment of all holy souls, our daily bread, in which is found every sweet delight. Be Thou my food and my refreshment; my refuge and my help; my wisdom; my portion, mine own possession and my treasure. May my soul ever thirst for Thee, Who art the source of life, the fount of wisdom and knowledge, the brightness of everlasting light, the flood of all true happiness, the riches of the house of God. Humble and discreet, loving and happy, ever ready and cheerful in Thy service, may I persevere, by Thy grace, even unto the end. In Thee, O Lord, may my mind and my heart remain fixed and firm, and rooted immovably for evermore. Amen
